International Development Studies : sustainability, participation, innovation (IDS) 2nd year

Presentation

Sustainable development requires innovative strategies, new conceptual and practical tools and holistic policies. Training provides a theoretical, empirical and practical understanding of global social, economic and environmental changes, providing students with the skills and knowledge needed to promote sustainable local development in the context of globalization. This is an innovative approach comparing innovations from the South and the North, while focusing on the global circulation of development strategies

This program is designed for students with a strong background in social sciences (e.g. Geography, Regional Planning, Anthropology, Economics, Political Science, International Relations, Development, etc.) and an interest in addressing development issues critically. A general introduction to international theories, debates and politics on 'development' will form the basis for addressing major challenges to sustainable local development from theory to practice. Multi-level case studies in Africa, South-East Asia, Latin America, Pacific, Indian Ocean and Europe will be used to discuss conceptual, practical and ethical issues of contemporary development programs and projects in relevant fields, such as poverty reduction, natural resource management, transformative social innovation, community based resource management and disaster risk reduction. The program consists of nine interactive courses followed by an internship within a host organization and the writing of a master dissertation.

Access to 2nd year is selective. Applicants should have a minimum qualification equivalent to four years of university studies (either fur years of bachelor or three years of bachelor plus one year at masters level)

in social sciences (e.g. geography, regional planning, anthropology, economics, political sciences, international relations, development studies)

Public continuing education : You are in charge of continuing education :

• if you resume your studies after 2 years of interruption of studies

• or if you followed training under the continuous training regime one of the previous 2 years

• or if you are an employee, job seeker, self-employed

If you do not have the diploma required to integrate the training, you can undertake **C** a validation of personal and professional achievements (VAPP)

Please note that candidats coming from a country outside European Union belonging to the CEF (*Centres pour les études en France* / Centres for Studies in France) (Algeria, Argentina, Benin, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Chile, China, Colombia, Congo, Gabon, Guinea, India, Ivory Coast, Japan, Lebanon, Madagascar, Mali, Mauritius, Mexico, Morocco, Peru, Russia, Senegal, South Korea, Syria, Taiwan, Tunisia, Turkey, United Sates of America, Vietnam) have to apply via Campus France (C http:// www.campusfrance.org/en). The application to the CEF

procedure is not free but the cost covers the visa, at a lower rate than normal.

Non EU students are strongly encouraged to apply for the first session in order to have enough time to obtain their visa.

Applicants should have a minimum qualification equivalent to four years of university studies

Target

French and international students with a strong background in social sciences (e.g. Geography, Regional planning, Anthropology, Economics, Political science, International relations, Development etc) and an interest in addressing development issues critically.

Prerequisites

All applicants are expected to have a solid background in social sciences or working experience in development cooperation. As students must be able to read textbooks, understand lectures, take part in classroom discussions and undertake written work in English, English B2 (upper intermediate) language proficiency has to be shown by one of the following : TOEFL score of at least 87 (internet based) IELTS score of at least 5.5 (internet based) Cambridge/ Oxford Advanced Certificate of Proficiency A degree from a university where English is the language of instruction. French students are legally exempted from these proficiency certificates. Their English language knowledge will be evaluated by the admissions committee. Applications will be carefully evaluated by the admissions committee. The committee assesses the quality of each application compared to the other applications received.
